### Summer Reading

Governor Pat Quinn, Secretary of State Jesse White and State Superintendent of Education Christopher A. Koch are urging educators and families to help students retain and develop academic skills by reading during summer vacation. The free online "Find a Book" utility at [www.lexile.com/findabook](http://www.lexile.com/findabook) provides a way for parents and children to quickly and easily search books that match a child's reading level and interests as well as to locate the local library carrying each title.

### **Physicals and Immunizations.**

It is important all physical, dental, and immunization requirements are met, and we have proper documentation prior to the start of school – August 21. According to the Illinois State Code, if a child does not present proof of health examination and immunizations by October 15th of a year in which such proof is required, the school district is required to suspend the child from school. This will be enforced. Thank you for your understanding and attention to this matter.

#### **PRE-SCHOOL**

- Physical exam is required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.
- Documentation of immunizations required: DTP/DTaP – 4 doses; Polio – 3 or more doses; HIB vaccination between 15-59 months of age; MMR – 1 dose; Hepatitis B – series of 3; and 1 dose of Varicella (chicken pox) – 1 dose vaccination on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday or documentation of prior disease.
- Lead screening – documentation of any previous test or physical statement that the test is not necessary based on screening questionnaire.

#### **KINDERGARTEN**

- Physical exam is required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.
- Documentation of immunizations required: DTP/DTaP – 4 or more doses, with the last booster on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday; Polio – 4 or more doses of combination IPV/OPV, or 3 or more doses of all-IPV or all-OPV, with the last booster on or after the 4<sup>th</sup> birthday; HIB not required for children 5 years of age or older; MMR - 2 doses, with the first on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday and the second dose no less than 4 weeks after the first dose; Hepatitis B – series of 3; Varicella (chicken pox) – 1 dose vaccination on or after the 1<sup>st</sup> birthday or documentation of prior disease.
- Dental exam is required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.
- Lead screening – documentation of any previous test or physical statement that the test is not necessary based on screening questionnaire.
- Vision exam is required. The required form will be in your registration packet.

#### **SECOND GRADE**

- Dental exam required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.

#### **SIXTH GRADE**

- Physical exam is required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.
- Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria, with pertussis component for adolescent) – 1 dose required.
- All other immunizations as required for kindergarten (see above).
- Dental exam required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.

#### **NINTH GRADE**

- Physical exam is required within twelve months prior to the beginning of the fall term.
- Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria, with pertussis component for adolescent) – 1 dose required.
- All other immunizations as required for kindergarten (see above).

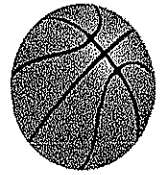

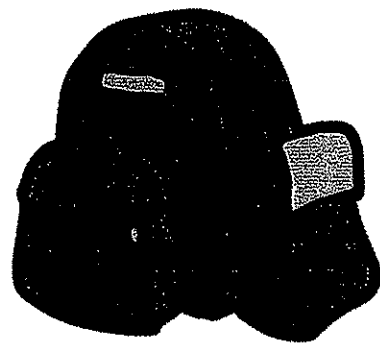
