Bedford County Public Schools is participating in the Summer Food Service Program. Meals will be provided to all children without charge and are the same for all children regardless of race, color, national origin, sex (including gender identity and sexual orientation), disability or age, and there will be no discrimination in the course of the meal service.

The USDA recently extended several nationwide waivers. Effective Monday, July 11, 2022, families that visit a summer feeding site will be allowed to take the meals off site for consumption. A parent or guardian may also pick up a meal for their child without the child being present.

Meals will be provided, on a first come, first serve basis, at the sites and times as follows:

- Bedford Primary School June 27th through July 21st, Monday-Thursday Only. Site will be closed on Monday, July 4th and operate Tuesday, July 5th through Friday, July 8th. Breakfast service only 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m.
- Big Island Elementary June 13th through June 30th, Monday-Thursday Only. Site will be Breakfast service only 9:45 a.m. to 10:00 a.m.
- Forest Elementary July 5th through July 21st, Monday – Thursday Only. Site will be Breakfast service only 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.
- Jefferson Forest High School July 5th through July 21st, Monday – Thursday. Site will be Breakfast service only 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m.
- Liberty Middle School June 27th through July 21st, Monday-Thursday Only. Site will be closed on Monday, July 4th and operate Tuesday, July 5th through Friday, July 8th. Breakfast 9:00 a.m. to 9:30 a.m. Lunch 12:15 p.m. to 12:45 p.m.
- Liberty High School July 5th through July 21st. The week of July 4th, site will operate Tuesday through Friday. All other weeks, the site will operate Monday through Thursday only. Breakfast service only 10:15 a.m. to 10:30 a.m.
- Moneta Elementary School June 27th through July 21st, Monday-Thursday Only. Site will be closed on Monday, July 4th and operate Tuesday, July 5th through Friday, July 8th. Breakfast 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. Lunch 12:00 p.m. to 1:00 p.m.
- Staunton River Middle School June 27th through July 21st, Monday-Thursday Only. Site will be closed on Monday, July 4th and operate Tuesday, July 5th through Friday, July 8th. Breakfast service only 8:50 a.m. to 9:10 a.m.

- Staunton River High School July 5th through July 21st. The week of July 4th, site will operate Tuesday through Friday. All other weeks, the site will operate Monday through Thursday only. Breakfast service only 9:50 a.m. to 10:10 a.m.
