- •New Haven Jr./Sr. High School provides an engaging curriculum, open and ongoing dialogue with parents, as well as holds high behavioral and academic expectations of its students promoting school pride and excellence.
- •Both schools have a variety of extracurricular opportunities for their students to be involved in. Academically they offer: Spell Bowl, Academic Super Bowl Teams, Drama Club, Cornerstone Connections after school program, tutoring, National Honors Society, Yearbook, and Student Council. Sports offered include: Cross Country, Football, Cheerleading, Tennis, Golf, Volleyball, Basketball, Wrestling, Soccer, and Track and Field.
