4. Two-Factor Authentication (2FA) is Coming! EACS's cybersecurity insurance carrier is requiring a 2FA tool to be put in place on district emails and Virtual Private Networks (VPNs). EACS will be using [Cisco Duo](#). Staff received an enrollment email from Duo on Thursday, December 9th. The email contained a link allowing staff to enroll with Duo. There is a short (about 2 mins) self-enrollment process for registering your phone/iPad and installing the [Duo Mobile application](#). Click [here](#) for a short video describing the enrollment process. If you do not want to use a smart-phone, you can enroll using a district-issued iPad. EACS will turn on two-factor authentication on December 14, 2021 on any logins to Office 365 (including Outlook, Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and OneDrive) outside of the school district network, and VPN access (only applying to a few individuals in the district). For all staff: With the upcoming email switch from GroupWise to Outlook, we are asking users to download the Outlook App for their EACS iPad and (this is a personal choice) for their personal phone. Fun technology fact: Here is an example of when cool and unique technology is taken advantage of by criminals, and it is creating problems. When Apple launched AirTags earlier this year, they seemed like a helpful tool to avoid losing valuable items like laptops, phones, tablets, or anything else. However, car thieves are now using them to track high-end vehicles, showing them the location of their target in real-time. It is easy to hide an AirTag in many places on a car, and criminals can track the location of a valuable car all day and night, learning patterns, and determine the best time/location to steal the car. Be aware, and search your Lamborghini or Bugatti for AirTags.
