

MS Boys Do Well at League

The Golden Plains Middle School boys performed well at the Western Kansas Liberty League Track Meet in Goodland on May 16. The seventh grade team placed second and the eighth grade team placed sixth out of the 11 teams competing.

AJ Camacho, 7<sup>th</sup> grade, brought home four gold medals-one in each event he entered. Camacho, placed first in the 100m (12.50), 200m (26.81), 400m (1:02.60), and long jump (16' 4.75"). This was the only time this season he had run the 200 and 400 and he achieved a personal best in long jump.

Seventh grader Jacob Ritter brought home a silver medal in the 100m hurdles (18.61) and competed in the 8<sup>th</sup> grade division to place 5<sup>th</sup> in the 4 x 200m relay with Jeron Schutte, Dylan Spresser, and Devin Carter with a time of 2:12.90 and ran the medley with Spresser, Colby Lathrop, and Carter for a best time of the season (2:11.10) and 4<sup>th</sup> place. Dylan Spresser received a bronze medal for this season best jump of 31' 4.75" in long jump for 3<sup>rd</sup> place. Sixth grader Bryce Ter Haar posted a personal best throw of 67' 1" in discus.

In the 8<sup>th</sup> grade division, points were scored by Devin Carter who placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the 400m (1:08.08), Clayton Bange who placed 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 1600m run (5:44.73) and 2<sup>nd</sup> in triple jump with a personal best jump of 29' 10". Jeron Schutte also scored team points in shot put (4<sup>th</sup>-30'11") and softball throw (4<sup>th</sup>-162'0").

This was the final competition of the year for the middle school. As the 8<sup>th</sup> grader move up to high school, next year, the middle schoolers will be continue to compete well for the Bulldogs. "I am pleased with how well these young athletes performed at league," said Coach Russ Aumiller. "The sixth and seventh grade students show tremendous potential for next season. I hope to see many of the eighth graders compete in high school."
