

Miller Exceeds 1000 Career Points By Judy Rogers

Golden Plains senior Kassie Miller has exceeded 1000 career points during her four years on the Lady Bulldogs basketball team.

Miller, who is the daughter of Mike and Tammy Miller of Rexford, exceeded 1000 points in the first round of the WKLL tournament in Colby on February 1. She is currently at 1095 points with several games remaining in her senior season.

Miller posted 238 points during her freshman season and 309 her sophomore year. As a junior, she reached 293, and has scored 255 so far this year. Her career high was 27 points in a single game against Logan/Palco as a sophomore and she scored 26 against Triplains/Brewster in the first round of the league tournament this year.

Kassie joins other GPHS girls in reaching this milestone, including Brenda Phillips-class of 1981, with 2003 career points, Amber Rogers-Class of 1993 with 1720, Katelyn Spresser—Class of 2007 with 1507, and her sister and this year's assistant coach KayCee Miller-Class of 2019 with 1159.

On the boys side, last year, Wade Rush reached the goal with 1065 points joining alumni Travis Schlenk-Class of 1992 with 1300, Parker Christensen-Class of 1985 with 1145, Jesse Miller-Class of 2005 with 1104, Josh Miller-Class of 2001 with 1101, and Donnie Delzeit-Class of 1986 with 1040.

“Reaching 1000 points has been my long-term goal as a Lady Bulldog,” said Miller. “This accomplishment is something I’m very proud of, but it wouldn’t have been possible without all my teammates throughout the past four years. Thank you to everyone who has been a part of the Lady Bulldogs basketball program and pushed me to be my best throughout the past four seasons.”
