

Phase V (Support) 90 days/90 consecutive days clean and sanction free

Treatment Requirements:

- Treatment Sessions
- Meetings with Case Manager as Required
- 2x Self-Help Meetings Weekly

Probation Requirements:

- Minimum 2x Random Drug Test Weekly
- Minimum of One Meeting Per Month
- Monthly Court Appearances
- Monthly Home Visit
- Minimum of 1 Meeting Every Other Week
- Curfew as Recommended
- Employment/GED Classes/Education
- Monthly Costs, Fines and Restitution Payments
- Community Service

Commencement Requirements:

- Full time employment
- Drug Treatment Court Program Costs to Date: Costs, Fines, Restitution Paid to Date
- Reflective Essay
- Specific written plans for Aftercare Phase and continuing sobriety and recovery.
- Stable Housing
- No pending legal matters or new charges which were incurred since enrollment into the Drug Treatment Court Program

Additional Comments:

- Sanctions may be imposed at any level of the drug treatment court program, as deemed necessary by the Drug Treatment Court Judge.
- As a participant of the Drug Treatment Court Program, individual phases may be extended to address violations or as a sanction, as determined by the Drug Treatment Court.

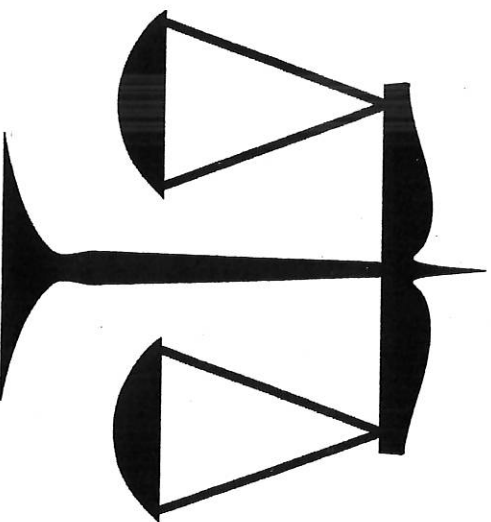

Program Description

The Schuylkill County Drug Treatment Court Program is a court supervised, comprehensive treatment program for non-violent defendants. It is a 14 month minimum program. The Program has (5) phase levels and an aftercare phase. The program is composed of a team of representatives who are part of the treatment community as well as the 21st Judicial District. This is a voluntary program designed to promote self-sufficiency and personal responsibility. The team members are present during this program to guide and assist the participant. However, the final responsibility is that of the participants. The participant must be motivated to change and commit to a responsible way of life. Successful completion of the program including the aftercare phase may result in the participant's charges being expunged.

Mission Statement

The Mission of the Schuylkill County Adult Drug Treatment Court is to improve the overall quality of life in our community. Providing a court-supervised program for substance dependent offenders that will enhance public safety, reduce recidivism, hold offenders accountable, reduce costs to our community, and ultimately transform these offenders into positive, contributing members of our community.

Target Population

- High Risk/High Need Substance abusers, with no history of violent or weapons offenses;
- addicts who engage in criminal thinking to support their addiction.
- Residents of Schuylkill County
- Willing and able to consent to the Drug Treatment Court Program.

PHASE I (STABILIZATION) 60 Days/14 consecutive days clean and sanction free

Treatment Requirements:

- Treatment Sessions
- Meetings with Case Manager as Required
- 2x Self-Help Meetings Weekly

Probation Requirements:

- Electronic Monitoring/Inpatient
- Minimum 2x Random Drug Test Weekly
- Minimum of 2 Weekly Meetings
- Home Visit Monthly
- Weekly Court Appearances
- Community Service if Sanctioned
- Curfew as Recommended
- Job Search(Develop)
- Establish Payment Plan

PHASE II (RECOVERY) 90 Days/30 consecutive days clean and sanction free

Treatment Requirements:

- Treatment Sessions
- Meetings with Case Manager as Required
- 2x Self-Help Meetings Weekly

Probation Requirements:

- Minimum 2x Random Drug Test Weekly
- Minimum of 2 Weekly Meetings
- Home Visit Monthly
- Curfew as Recommended
- Weekly Court Appearances
- Community Service if Sanctioned
- Employment, GED Classes/Education
- Monthly Costs, Fines and Restitution Payments

Phase III(Transition) 90 Days/45 consecutive days clean and sanction free

Treatment Requirements:

- Treatment Sessions
- Meetings with Case Manager as Required
- 3x Self-Help Meetings Weekly

Probation Requirements:

- Minimum 2x Random Drug Test Weekly
- Minimum of 1 Meeting Every Other Week
- Curfew as Recommended
- Home Visit Monthly
- Bi-Weekly Court Appearances
- Community Service 20 Hours
- Employment/GED Classes/Education
- Monthly Costs, Fines, and Restitution Payments
- Establish Pro-Social Activity
- Complete Life Skills Group

PHASE IV(PRE-RELEASE) 90 Days/90 consecutive days clean and sanction free

- Treatment Sessions
- Meetings With Case Manager as Required
- 3x Self-Help Meetings Weekly

Probation Requirements:

- Minimum 2x Random Drug Test Weekly
- Bi-Weekly Court Appearances
- Monthly Home Visit

- Curfew as Recommended
- Employment/GED Classes/Education
